



Program Success (October 2016 - August 2023)

1,136 students participated in a work experience and have graduated from the program since 2016.

5,913 **Extended Learning** Opportunities have been completed, 3699.5 academic credits earned with 57.25 additional credits gained through the computer lab.

738 students graduated from high school following the program and 400 students are on the pathway to graduation.

Upon program completion, 99.8% of students reengaged with their education:

224 students graduated immediately.

students returned to high school.


students attended alternative education.

The IMPACCT Program provides Extended Learning Opportunities (ELOs) to students with disabilities who are at-risk of dropping out of high school.



The average student attendance rate is

90%



of students have IEPs due to severe learning or emotional disabilities.

14% of the students have 504 plans.

The majority of IMPACCT students receive free and reduced lunch.





The IMPACCT Program is a partnership between New Hampshire Vocational Rehabilitation and Granite State Independent Living in response to the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). IMPACCT was created to help augment and support the transitional services that schools are already providing their students with disabilities.
